Please review these rules and be prepared to follow them before attending the hearing.

- You need current photo ID to enter the federal courthouse.
- There is a metal detector you'll need to walk through, and so you and your bag will be scanned with the X ray. No weapons of any sort are permitted.
 Think of the rules for getting on a plane—if you couldn't take it on a plane, it can't go into a federal building.
- NO cameras are permitted, including those on your cell phone. Even a
 phone that is turned off won't be allowed into the building if it has camera
 capabilities. Bottom line: leave any phone-with-a-camera in your car.

There is metered street parking on every side of the building.

Phones with NO camera abilities are permitted into the building, but they must be off while in the courtroom itself.

The trial is scheduled to begin Tuesday, April 10th at 9:00 a.m. The trial will be held in Courtroom #2 in front of Judge Laurie Smith Camp. We expect to be in court on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. It is possible it will carry on to Friday.

You can attend any portion of the trial, which means you may arrive and depart at any point, but just do so quietly and respectfully for the proceedings.
